Education Grants are for you

What:

\$1,000 to \$4,500 each year – so you can get the training you need for the future you want.

Who:

Every Itasca area student who wants a better future. You don't have to be the top of your class, or an athlete, or on the yearbook staff.

Why:

To help you "fill the gap" between the cost of your chosen school, and the amount you or your family can afford to pay.

What schools can I go to?

You can go to any accredited program anywhere in the United States – including online. This includes *certificate programs*, *community college*, *tribal college*, *college* and *university*. Education Grants fund only up to bachelor's degrees. Graduate and doctorate degree studies are not eligible.

You can apply if you are

- Under age 25 as of September 1, 2019.
- A high school graduate of: Bigfork, Blackduck, Bug O Nay Ge Shig, Deer River, Grand Rapids, Greenway, Hill City, Nashwauk-Keewatin, Northland (Remer), Northome, Northern Lights Community School.
- A homeschooled student who would have graduated from one of these schools.
- Enrolled at any accredited educational institution in the U.S.
- Registered as a full-time student (12 credits per semester or quarter). Part-time students (6-11 credits per semester or quarter) are considered on a case-by-case basis.
- Making progress (GPA 2.0 or higher) toward your degree/certificate.

How often?

You must reapply every year. Awards are not automatically renewed each year.

How to apply

Online

At www.blandinfoundation.org/educationgrants you'll find the application form and step-by-step instructions. You can save your progress, log out if needed and return at a later time to add more information.

Fill out the enclosed Application and Financial Aid Information Release Form. Mail them to the address on the application, or drop them off at the Blandin Foundation office.

Just like the online form, you can provide the rest of the items that complete your application later.

Going to Itasca Community College? Use the steps below to complete the correct application:

Do not complete this application. Instead, please apply for a Blandin Foundation Education Grant directly through ICC by following a two-step process.

1. Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.ed.gov and list ICC's school code – **#002356**. This allows ICC to receive your results. Follow up on any additional paperwork from ICC related to your application, if requested.
2. Complete the ICC Blandin Foundation Education Grant application at www.itascacc.edu/forms by **March 1**. Once you have completed both steps, ICC can calculate your eligibility for an Education Grant. Funds are limited, so apply early!

Fill out the FAFSA

You can fill out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) as early as **October 1**. This form helps determine your financial need. Get one at www.fafsa.ed.gov or call **(800) 433-3243** to order a paper copy. Once your FAFSA is processed, you will get access to your federal Student Aid Report (SAR). Send your SAR to Blandin Foundation.

Make the deadline - March 1

Your complete application is due on this date. We may consider extensions on occasion.
